




COUNTRY FACT SHEET:

OPOLAD supports Argentina in the implementation of its National Plan for Drug Demand Reduction. Technical support is channelled through two national actions, three regional initiatives, and through the country's participation in six of the Programme's working

groups. Support focuses on the "generating empirical evidence" component (strengthening observatories and evaluating policies). Support has also been provided in the preparation of a draft law on the social use of confiscated property.

STRENGTHENING DRUG OBSERVATORIES

GENDER MAINSTREAMING IN DRUG RESEARCH

Support to the Argentine Drug in incorporating the gender approach in a study on the treatment of addiction, particularly in users of the federal network of Casas Comunitarias Convivenciales (special housing for drug users). The study analyses the barriers to access and the reconciliation of treatment with childcare responsibilities for women and members of the LGBTIQ+ community.

WASTE WATER STUDY IN ARGENTINA

Technical support for the development and prioritisation of methodological strategies for the execution of the study on waste water in the country. This process will allow the epidemiological information available to be supplemented for a more accurate characterisation of consumption, including consumption that is unknown or has a low population presence. It will also be a relevant input within the framework of the functions of the Early Warning System of Argentina.



REDUCING THE SUPPLY OF DRUGS

INCORPORATION OF THE GENDER DIMENSION IN THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN DRUG TRAFFICKING AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

Within the framework of the initiative "The gender dimension in the relationship between drug trafficking and human trafficking", which is implemented through the coordination of three networks of AIAMP (Ibero-American Association of Public Prosecutors): Ibero-American Network of Prosecutors against Trafficking in Persons and Smuggling of Migrants - REDTRAM; the Network of Ibero-American Anti-Drug Prosecutors – RFAI; and the Specialised Network on Gender – REG), COPOLAD has completed a diagnosis and a proposal for regional guidelines.

One of the pilot countries for the initiative will be Argentina, whose Public Prosecutor's Office is also involved in the coordination of the three networks mentioned. The aim is to generate guidelines for Argentine prosecutors, which include indicators for early detection of these cases and the design of instructions to improve the coordination of investigations into this type of crime.
