



OCCUNTRY FACT SHEET: PERU

OPOLAD provides comprehensive support to Peru in the implementation of its *National Anti-Drug Policy to 2030* (approved in 2022). Technical support is channelled through three national actions, three regional initiatives, and through the

country's participation in seven of the Programme's working groups. The programme's support focuses on reducing demand (territorialisation and community treatment) and supply (comprehensive sustainable alternative development and the fight against organised crime). At the same time, and from a cross-cutting perspective, support is being provided for an Early Warning System to protect native communities.

REDUCING THE DEMAND FOR DRUGS

DESIGN OF TWO COMMUNITY TREATMENT PROJECTS IN THE AMAZON (PUCALLPA) AND THE URBAN AREA SURROUNDING LIMA.

Support to DEVIDA in preparing a "Guide to the implementation and evaluation of the proposed Comprehensive Community Intervention for the Reduction of Demand for Drugs" in the Amazon (Coronel

Portillo, Pucallpa) and in the urban area surrounding Lima. It is planned to coordinate local governments and civil society organisations to promote a support system for communities in vulnerable situations.



THE FIGHT AGAINST DRUG TRAFFICKING AND ORGANISED CRIME:

DESIGN OF ECONOMIC, FINANCIAL, TAX AND ACCOUNTING ANALYSIS TOOLS IN COMBATING THE LAUNDERING OF ASSETS FROM DRUG TRAFFICKING

Through an agreement with DEVIDA, the programme supports the anti-money laundering unit of the National Police to develop economic, financial, tax and accounting

analysis tools to prepare expert evidence in processes involving the laundering of assets from drug trafficking.



ALTERNATIVE DEVELOPMENT (AD)

REGIONAL STUDY ON AD IN NON-TRADITIONAL CONTEXTS WITH CASE STUDIES IN PERU

GIZ has launched a regional study on innovative approaches to AD in "non-traditional" contexts. The research team has coordinated with DEVIDA to include case studies in Peru, both in border and vulnerable areas and in native territories and communities.

QUALIFICATION OF TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL IN THE FIELD OF AD AND GENDER

DEVIDA has taken advantage of the certified training on AD and Gender, provided by GIZ, by opening the course to the participation of around 50 civil servants (line directorates, decentralised offices and administrative units). This training complemented the internal awareness-raising work of DEVIDA's own Gender Committee, and was very well received due to its innovative nature (both in terms of content and of the module-based self-learning format).



SOCIAL INNOVATION LABORATORY TO PROMOTE AN EARLY WARNING SYSTEM TO PROTECT NATIVE COMMUNITIES FROM ILLEGAL DRUG CULTIVATION BUSINESSES

Support of the Agirre Centre to DEVIDA in promoting an advanced experimentation space consisting of Early Warning System to protect native communities in territories affected by the invasion of settlers in illicit businesses (illegal logging and coca cultivation) in the Flor de Ucayali native community (Peruvian Amazon). We work in close coordination with the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights (MinJUS) and the Public Defender's Office.

Four blocks of innovation prototypes have been identified, which coordinate public services (anticipatory system of

alert indicators, patrolling, connectivity) with community actions (indigenous surveillance and AD initiatives) as well as involving institutionalisation and escalation to national level (through the MinJUS and the Public Defender's Office). The main innovation commitment lies in creating inter-institutional coordination between the different existing monitoring systems, including the Mechanism for the Protection of Human Rights Defenders (MinJUS), environmental oversight and official monitoring of park rangers in protected areas (MINAM).
